Why?



Have you ever had a student tell you they wanted to be an agriculture teacher? Did they come back at registration time and ask, “What course should I sign up for to learn how to be an agriculture teacher?” Do you wish there was a way you could mentor this young person into becoming an agriculture leader/ teacher?

Do you struggle with allowing FFA officers work on chapter planning while they are in your agriculture class? Do you wish there was a way to allow them to carry out chapter tasks while at the same time completing a viable course in agriculture?

If you have answered yes to either of these scenarios then the GOAL class is just what you are looking for in your curriculum offerings!

Where did GOAL come from?

In 2007, national board certified agriculture teachers from four high schools set out to create a course to empower students to explore teaching agriculture. With help from a USDA Secondary Education Challenge Grant in 2008 we were able to make this dream course reality!

How Does the GOAL Class Work?

The unique design of GOAL allows an agriculture educator to continue to serve the current students in agriscience classes, while at the same time overseeing the student(s) who is/are enrolled in the on-line GOAL course. Weekly students in the GOAL course complete readings, observations, worksheets and other assignments and turn those into you. You assign grades and can modify assignments to fit your situation!

Key GOAL Components

- One day per week students go to elementary school and carry out PALS.
- Write 6-8 minute speech on agriculture topic and present to adult group in community.
- Develop a Food for America program and present it in elementary school.
- Create and implement a teaching unit in a high school agriscience class.
- Fill out proficiency award in Agriculture Education area.
